Greetings, fellow Rotarians!



acy. Why the focus on education? Rotary International says, "Our goal is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity

in education, and increase adult literacy. We support education for all children and literacy for children and adults.". Sounds great, right? So how do WE as Rotarians help support these efforts? Rotary.org showcases some examples happening around the globe with Rotary members opening a girls' school in Afghanistan to break the cycle of poverty and social imbalance and new teaching methods being utilized in South Africa and Puerto Rico to teach children to recognize letters by sounds instead of names.

Back in July we heard about the Coztal Ixil language book project we partnered with that incorporates books for early readers in an oral culture. Through club members and community support we have assisted a high school in Muko, Uganda with access to fresh water by installing a rainwater capture and storage system as well as a state-of-the-art water filtration system at the school. We also supported clean water and sanitation efforts with other clubs in our District in the Dominican Republic which allows students to be healthier and receive a better education. Our 'Gather at Grove' events featured a local author and our club purchased her books for the children to take home and enjoy. This year we have an ex-



citing project we are collaborating with other clubs in our District for some vocational training; Be sure to read more about it on page 5!



Annual Club Dues Announcement

The Board of Directors recently voted to continue financial assistance for annual club dues in light of the continued disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic with the remaining funds that were donated in 2020-2021 to members that may have difficulty paying their dues for the 2021-2022 fiscal year. As originally designated in the 2020-2021 plan, any remaining monies will be sent to Rotary International at year's end.



Honduras Vocational Training Project

The project is a partnership of the Mt. Pleasant Rotary Club and the CMU Chapter of Global Brigades. The Brigades' vision and mission align closely with Rotary's global grant criteria; specifically, local community involvement and collaboration with nonprofit partners using measurable outcomes. The UN's Sustainable Development Goals, with which the CMU Global Brigades are aligned, include Good Health and Wellbeing, Clean Water & Sanitation, and Decent Work & Economic Growth.

The total cost of the project is \$8,000-\$10,000. The Mt. Pleasant Club will fund \$4,000 and is actively seeking partner clubs and private individuals to fund the balance of \$4,000-\$6,000. Our club has pledged \$2,000 toward this project.

The goal of the VTT is to provide concrete medical updates for medical personnel in small Honduran villages as they work with Global Brigades.

The main source of training will be CMU's College of Medicine. Much of the actual training would take place at McLaren-Central Michigan, Mid-Michigan Health, and Saginaw hospitals.

Midland Rotary Foundation Grant Cycle

The Midland Rotary Foundation (MRF) is a separate 501(c)(3) charitable organization, established in 1977 so that Rotarians could make tax deductible contributions that would benefit the Midland area community. They are accepting applications through September 30th for their fall grant cycle. The criteria for funding is listed below:

- 1. The requesting organization should be located in Midland County or the project should benefit Midland County residents.
- 2. Aside from established scholarship funds, a grant should benefit many rather than a few individuals.
- 3. Grants are usually made for specific projects or purchases rather than ongoing initiatives or operating expenses of an organization.
- 4. Preference will be given to requests that benefit disadvantaged youth living in Midland County.
- 5. Grant requests must be sponsored by a member of the Midland Rotary Club.
